 - Name and location of facility/organization/affiliation
 - Clinical purpose/rationale
 - Objectives
 - Methodology
 - o Result
 - Discussion
 - Conclusion
 - Reference list

Please note: Product trade names may not be included in the title, abstract body, or poster. Use generic names only followed by an asterisk, then list the trade name at the end of the abstract or poster.

Poster Guidelines

- > Size no larger than 4 x 8 feet
- > Follow the established schedule for set-up and teardown times
- ➤ Do not display company or product information within the poster references to company and brand names may be placed in the right lower corner in either a footnote or acknowledgement section. Do not use company logos.
- Suggestions for arranging materials:
 - Title, author, and affiliation should be at the top of your poster with lettering at least one inch high
 - An introduction should be placed at the upper left and a conclusion at the lower right, in type large enough to read at two feet or more
 - Your poster should be self-explanatory
 - The sequence of illustrations should be indicated with numbers or letters at least one inch high
